Table title - Table 1 : Employment (other than those in the Civil Service) by selected major industry

Number of persons engaged (employment) for the manufacturing in June 2011 was 113800. It represented a decrease of 5.0% or 6000 persons when compared with June 2010.

Number of persons engaged (employment) for the manufacturing in June 2010 was 119800.

Number of manual workers (employment) for the construction sites in June 2011 was 58600. It represented an increase of 5.6% or 3100 persons when compared with June 2010.

Number of manual workers (employment) for the construction sites in June 2010 was 55500.

Number of persons engaged (employment) for the import and export trade in June 2011 was 496800. It represented a decrease of 0.3% or 1500 persons when compared with June 2010.

The number of vacancies for the manufacturing in June 2011 was 2160. It represented an increase of 50% or 710 when compared with June 2010.

The number of vacancies for the manufacturing in June 2010 was 1450.

The number of vacancies for manual workers at construction sites in June 2011 was 300. It represented an increase of 412% or 240 when compared with June 2010. The large year-on-year percentage change was attributable to the low base of comparison in June 2010. Please refer to "Limitations of the Survey" in Part V of the Quarterly Report of Employment and Vacancies at Construction Sites, June 2011.

The number of vacancies for manual workers at construction sites in June 2010 was 60.

The number of vacancies for the import and export trade in June 2011 was 6970. It represented an increase of 27% or 1470 when compared with June 2010.

The number of vacancies for the import and export trade in June 2010 was 5500.

The number of vacancies for the wholesale in June 2011 was 1290. It represented an increase of 118% or 700 when compared with June 2010.

The number of vacancies for the wholesale in June 2010 was 590.

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Table title - Table 4 : Changes of employment and vacancies over three-month period (other than those in the Civil Service)

Percentage change in employment over three-month period in June 2011 was +0.5% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +0.6% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in vacancies over three-month period in June 2011 was -0.9% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +3.5% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in employment over three-month period in March 2011 was +1.0% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +1.2% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in vacancies over three-month period in March 2011 was +18.8% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +3.4% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in employment over three-month period in December 2010 was +1.2% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +0.9% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in vacancies over three-month period in December 2010 was -5.8% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +11.3% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in employment over three-month period in September 2010 was +0.5% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +0.5% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in vacancies over three-month period in September 2010 was +13.0% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +5.1% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in employment over three-month period in June 2010 was +0.3% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +0.3% based on the seasonally adjusted series.

Percentage change in vacancies over three-month period in June 2010 was -1.6% based on the original series (i.e. not seasonally adjusted), and +3.2% based on the seasonally adjusted series.
