Objectives

- Enhance students' aesthetic appreciation and enrich their artistic knowledge
- Nurture students' creativity and talents
- Provide an opportunity for teacher to grasp the role as producer
- Develop talents for professional digital video production
- Provide a platform for students to tap into the experiences and insights of the veteran film-makers

Uniqueness of the Seeds Project

- Provide participants with a clear and systematic overview on the key professions in digital video production through a series of structured workshops. The workshops cover the five key professions, viz., directing, cinematography and lighting, sound design, post-production and idea generation in script writing. These workshops would enable students to identify specific professions that suit their interests.
- Putting theories into practice:
 - Students will be given a valuable chance to practice video-making in the professional and industry-standard studios at the Academy of Film.
 - The short video competition will serve as an exchange platform for the workshop and seminar participants as well as the rest of the secondary students. The award presentation ceremony will showcase these budding talents to the professionals in the creative industry.
- The workshops and seminars also place emphasis on the importance of team work as the key success factor. Teachers will be given guidance in facilitating the organisation of an effective and efficient student production team.
