

Special Stamp Issue – “Hong Kong Buses”
on 24 September 2013

The special stamps on “Hong Kong Buses” are designed by Mr. LEUNG Kam-hung. The stamps and \$5 Stamp Sheetlet are printed in lithography by Cartor Security Printing of France, whereas the \$20 Stamp Sheetlet is printed in lithography plus lenticular by Joh. Enschede B.V. of the Netherlands.

Date-stamping Arrangements

A hand-back date-stamping service using the office steel date-stamp and the special postmark will be provided on 24 September at all post offices for official/privately-made covers bearing the first day of issue indication and a local address. All philatelic offices will also provide hand-back date-stamping service using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark and the philatelic office pictorial postmark concurrently, but the GPO-1 date-stamp will only be available at the General Post Office.

The public hall of the Hongkong Post Philatelic Bureau will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on 24 September to provide date-stamping service using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark and the special postmark.
