### **Date-stamping Arrangements**

A hand-back date-stamping service using the office steel date-stamp and the special postmark will be provided on April 29 at all post offices for official/privately-made covers bearing the first day of issue indication and a local address. All philatelic offices will also provide hand-back date-stamping service using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark and the philatelic office pictorial postmark concurrently, but the GPO-1 date-stamp will only be available at the General Post Office.

A cachet will be available for application on covers from April 29 to July 28 at all philatelic

offices during normal office hours, and also throughout the period from April 30 to August 26 at the exhibition venue at the Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre.

The public hall of the Hongkong Post Philatelic Bureau will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on April 29 to provide date-stamping service, using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark, the special postmark and the cachet.
