on 18 September 2014**

The stamp sheetlet is designed by Ms. Shirman Lai, and printed in lithography with hot foil stamping by Joh. Enschede B.V. of the Netherlands.

## **Date-stamping Arrangements**

A hand-back date-stamping service using the office steel date-stamp and the special postmark will be provided on 18 September 2014 at all post offices for official/privately-made covers bearing the first day of issue indication and a local address. All philatelic offices will also provide hand-back date-stamping service using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark and the philatelic office pictorial postmark concurrently, but the GPO-1 date-stamp will only be available at the General Post Office. A cachet on the stamp exhibition will also be available to mark the event. Application of the cachet will be available at all philatelic offices on 18 September 2014.

The public hall of the Hongkong Post Philatelic Bureau will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on 18 September 2014 to provide date-stamping service using the “Philatelic Bureau” pictorial postmark, the special postmark and cachet.
