(2) Compensation of employees includes wages and salaries as well as payments in kind and employer's social security expenditure such as contributions to Mandatory Provident Fund schemes and premiums for employee's compensation insurance.

(3) Operating expenses include consumption of materials and supplies, rent and rates for land and buildings, interest payments, payments for repair and maintenance services, transport and travelling expenses, communications expenses, insurance premiums, entertainment expenses, accounting fees and other expenses for business services, etc. Provision, gain/loss on disposal of fixed assets, bad debts, penalties, write-off, donations to charities, insurance excesses, depreciation, amortisation and taxation payments are not included in operating expenses.
