

### Concessionary tariff schemes operated by the two power companies in 2015

Tariff for Low Consumption Consumers	<p>Customers with consumption of not more than 400 units per bimonthly bill are entitled to an Energy Saving Rebate at following rates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 17.2 cents per unit for total consumption not more than 200 units per bimonthly bill;</li> <li>● 16.2 cents per unit for total consumption between 201 to 300 units per bimonthly bill;</li> <li>● 15.2 cents per unit for total consumption between 301 to 400 units per bimonthly bill.</li> </ul>	<p>Customers with consumption of not more than 100 units in a month are entitled to receive a 5% Super Saver Discount.</p>
Concessionary Tariff	<p>Customers aged 60 or above who live either alone or with other similarly qualified elderly, and who are relying on or entitled to Comprehensive Social Security Assistance, are entitled to apply for the Concessionary Tariff for the Elderly.</p> <p>The approved applicant will be offered half-price for the first 400 units of electricity consumed in two months plus an exemption of the minimum charge per bimonthly bill.</p> <p>The Energy Saving Rebate for Residential Tariff is still applicable to these customers.</p>	<p>Customers under Concessionary Tariff Scheme for the Elderly / Disabled / Single-Parent Families / Unemployed are entitled to receive 60% discount for the first 200 units of electricity consumed in a month plus the exemption of the payment of deposit and Minimum Charge. The Super Saver Discount is also applicable to customers under the Concessionary Tariff Scheme.</p>
