An Example to illustrate how the CSSA payment is calculated

A 4-member family comprises the unemployed able-bodied applicant, his wife who is a homemaker, and two children aged 16 and 7 respectively. The elder child is a full-day higher secondary school student and needs to take lunch away from home while the younger child is studying in a half-day primary school. Monthly expenses of the family include rent of \$3,500, water and sewage charges and fares to and from school of \$400 for the two children. The amount of monthly **CSSA** payable to this incomeless family is:

Note 1: The amount to be allowed for rent is the actual rent paid or the maximum rent allowance (MRA) appropriate to the number of eligible members in a family, whichever is the less. The MRA with effect from February 2016 is as follows:

Note 2: The amount of grant to cover fares to and from school is calculated by the actual expenses paid (normally by the cheapest means of available transport).

Moreover, a flat-rate grant is payable to full-time students up to the upper secondary level for selected items of school related expenses (i.e., books, stationery, school uniforms, miscellaneous and minor one-off expenses). The rates for the 2016/17 school year are as follows:

The special grant to cover costs of glasses is payable to children. The amount of this grant is up to a maximum of \$500. Normally, the special grant is given to cover the cost of only one pair of glasses within 24 months.
