- 2. The Office of the Government Chief Information Officer (OGCIO) did not set "target utilisation rate" for different services under the ILSP. However, the OGCIO stipulate KPIs in the Funding and Operation Agreements signed with the implementers and evaluate annually the actual achievements against the KPIs. The KPIs include the number of families enrolled, the number of families served, the number of families first served and the number of services.
