Shortfall of land for residential uses 230 ha

Yet to take into account public aspiration for improvement in average living space per person

Yet to take into account the land required for building up a land reserve

land for infrastructure and facilities 720 ha



> Total shortfall will be more than 1,200 ha


Why Land Shortage?
