By aggregating the expenditure patterns of all households covered by the above three indices, a Composite CPI is also compiled.

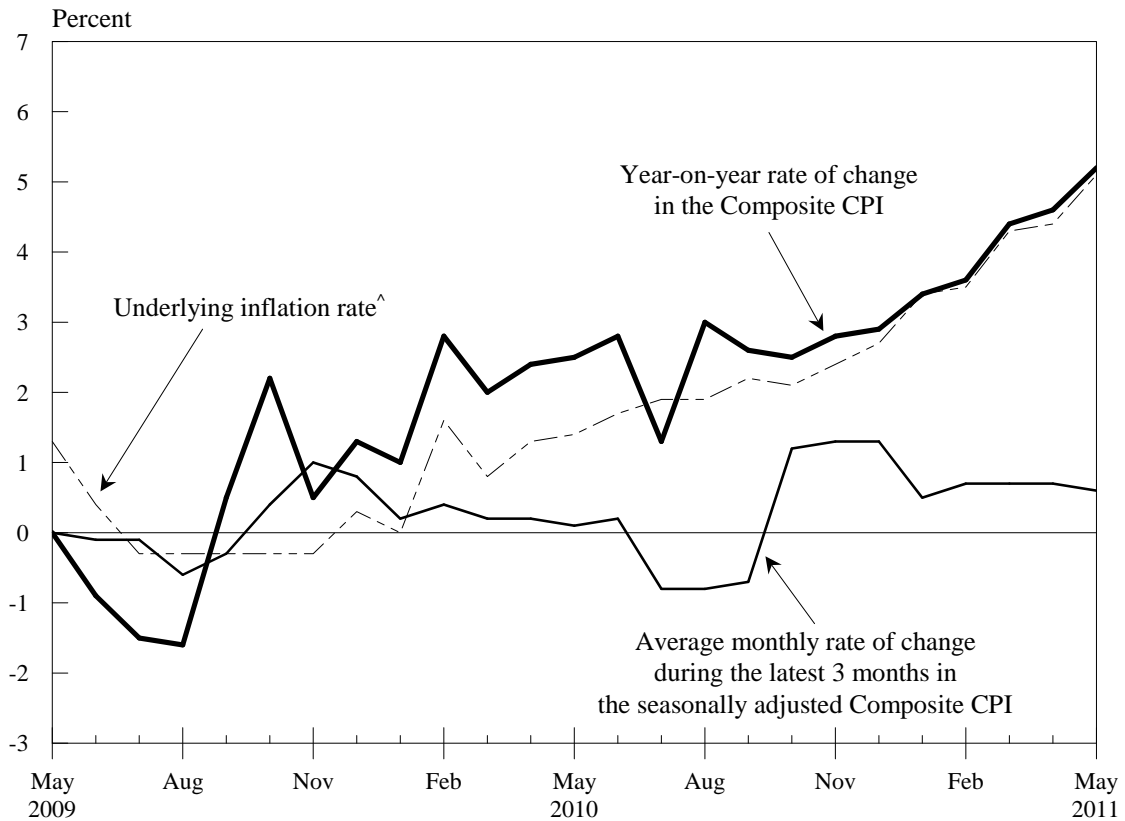
