<b>Ratio of doctors per 1 000 obstetrics and gynaecology inpatient and day inpatient discharges and deaths</b> (tentative figure)  Note: The manpower figure is calculated on full-time equivalent basis (including permanent, contract and temporary staff in Hospital Authority's (HA) workforce but excluding interns) as at November 30, 2015. Instead of using the patient headcount, HA measures and monitors its service throughput by performance indicators such as number of patient discharge episodes and patient days. This is because patient headcount is unable to reflect in full the services (e.g. admission/attendance, discharge and transfer involving possibly multiple specialties, service units and hospitals) delivered to patients in their treatment.	1.28
<b>Average weekly work hour</b> (2014-15 figure)  Note: The average weekly work hour is calculated on actual calendar week basis based on rostered hours and hours of performing called-back duties while on off-site calls as reported by doctors.
