Requirements imposed by the Secretary for Food and Health under Cap. 599F and Cap. 599G

	Requirements (15 July to 21 July 2020)
Catering business premises selling or supplying food or drink for consumption on the premises of the business	<p>(I) Ceasing of selling food and drinks for consumption on premises during specified period</p> <p>a. Selling or supplying food or drink for consumption on the premises of any catering business must be ceased from 6.00pm to 4.59am of the subsequent day</p> <p>b. Any premises, or part of the premises, on which food or drink is sold or supplied by the business for consumption on the premises must be closed from 6.00pm to 4.59am of the subsequent day</p> <p>(II) Measures Required on the Premises</p> <p>c. Must wear mask except when eating/drinking</p> <p>d. Screen body temperature</p> <p>e. Provide hand sanitizer</p> <p>f. Tables 1.5m apart or effectively partitioned</p> <p>g. Must not exceed 50% of normal seating capacity</p> <p>h. No more than 4 persons each table</p> <p>(III) Suspension of Activities</p> <p>i. No live performance and dancing</p> <p>j. Suspend karaoke and mahjong-tin kau activities</p> <p>(IV) Closure of Premises</p> <p>k. Any premises (commonly known as bar or pub) that is exclusively or mainly used for the sale or supply of intoxicating liquors for consumption in that premises must be closed</p> <p>l. Any part of a catering business premise that is exclusively or mainly used for the sale or supply of intoxicating liquors for consumption in that part must be closed</p>
Scheduled premises	Close amusement game centres, bathhouses, fitness centres, places of entertainment, places of public entertainment, party rooms, clubs or nightclubs, karaoke establishments, mahjong-tin kau premises, beauty parlours and massage establishments
Scheduled premises: club-houses	<p>a. save for catering premises therein, club-houses must be closed</p> <p>b. catering premises in club-houses must follow the directions set out for catering premises</p>
	Requirements (15 July to 28 July 2020)
Group gatherings of 4 persons or above	Prohibited in public places unless exempted

Premises excluded from massage establishments

- (a) a hospital or maternity home maintained by the HKSAR Government or registered under the Hospitals, Nursing Homes and Maternity Homes Registration Ordinance (Cap. 165)
- (b) a military hospital or a maternity home of the Hong Kong Garrison
- (c) an establishment for medical treatment operated by a medical practitioner registered under the Medical Registration Ordinance (Cap. 161)
- (d) an establishment for physiotherapy operated by a physiotherapist registered under the Supplementary Medical Professions Ordinance (Cap. 359)
- (e) the premises for practising Chinese medicine operated by a registered Chinese medicine practitioner or listed Chinese medicine practitioner as defined in section 2 of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Cap. 549)
- (f) the premises for chiropractic operated by a chiropractor registered under the Chiropractors Registration Ordinance (Cap. 428)

Exempted group gatherings

1. Group gathering for the purposes of or related to transportation
2. Group gathering for performing any governmental function
3. Group gathering for performing any function of a statutory body or an advisory body of the Government
4. Group gathering at a place of work for the purposes of work
5. Group gathering for obtaining or receiving hospital or healthcare service at a healthcare facility
6. Group gathering of persons living in the same household
7. Group gathering for—
 - (a) the conduct of proceedings in a court, magistrates' court or tribunal;
 - (b) the performance of any function of a judge or judicial officer; or
 - (c) the conduct of any other business of the Judiciary
8. Group gathering necessary for the proceedings in the Legislative Council or a District Council
9. Group gathering during a funeral, or during any other occasion for mourning for or remembering a deceased who has yet to be buried or cremated (including any ritual or ceremony held in the vicinity of the place where the deceased died or suffered fatal injury to mourn for the death of the deceased)
10. Group gathering of not more than 20 persons during a wedding ceremony at which no food or drink is served
11. Group gathering during any of the following meetings at which no food or drink is served and, in the case of a group gathering of more than 20 persons, measures are in place for separating the participants in the gathering in different rooms or partitioned areas, each accommodating not more than 20 persons—
 - (a) a meeting of a body that must be held within a specified period in order to comply with any Ordinance or other regulatory instrument that governs the operation of the body or its business;
 - (b) a shareholders' meeting of a company listed on a recognized stock market (as defined by section 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Cap. 571)) that is held in accordance with any Ordinance or other regulatory instrument that governs the operation of the company or its business

12. Group gathering held for imparting information or skills, or handling supplies or items, that are conducive to the prevention and control of the specified disease
13. Group gathering at any premises to which a direction issued under section 6 or 8 of the Prevention and Control of Disease (Requirements and Directions) (Business and Premises) Regulation (Cap. 599 sub. leg. F) applies, except premises that, according to the direction, must be closed
