15 May 2021 Details of Compulsory Testing Notice

(*Persons who have completed a COVID-19 vaccination course¹ would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in the compulsory testing notices*)

A. Residential Buildings (including building for both commercial and residential uses) with one or more new cases

- 1. Any person who had been present at any of the below specified premises for more than two hours at any time during the period from May 2 to May 15, 2021 (including but not limited to residents, visitors and workers), has to undergo testing by May 18, 2021. If persons subject to compulsory testing have previously undergone testing between May 13 and May 15, 2021, they would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in the compulsory testing notice.
 - Yee King Building, 67E Waterloo Road, Ho Man Tin, Kowloon, Hong Kong
 - (2) Block 13 of Pak Tin Estate, 51 Pak Tin Street, Sham Shui Po, Kowloon, Hong Kong

B. Specified premises under additional testing

- 1. Any person who had been present at any of the below specified premises for more than one hour at any time during the period from April 15 to May 5, 2021 (including but not limited to full-time, part-time and relief staff and visitors), has to undergo testing by May 18, 2021. If persons subject to compulsory testing have previously undergone testing between May 13 and May 15, 2021, they would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in the compulsory testing notice.
 - Urban Bakery Works, Shop 322, 3/F, Landmark Atrium, 15 Queen's Road Central, Central, Hong Kong

¹ If a person subject to compulsory testing has completed a COVID-19 vaccination course, he/she would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in this Notice. For both the Sinovac COVID-19 vaccine (CoronaVac vaccine) and Fosun Pharma/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine (Comirnaty vaccine), completion of the vaccination course in general means having received two doses of COVID-19 vaccine 14 days ago, i.e. having received the second dose of COVID-19 vaccine on or before May 4, 2021. For persons previously infected with COVID-19, they may be deemed to have completed the COVID-19 vaccine 14 days ago, i.e. having received one dose of COVID-19 vaccine or one dose of CoronaVac vaccine 14 days ago, i.e. having received one dose of COVID-19 vaccine on or before May 4, 2021. For persons previously infected with COVID-19, they may be deemed to have completed the COVID-19 vaccine 14 days ago, i.e. having received one dose of COVID-19 vaccine on or before May 4, 2021. For persons who received COVID-19 vaccines in places outside of Hong Kong and have received the recommended dose(s) as stipulated in relevant guidelines 14 days ago, i.e. having received all of the recommended dose(s) of COVID-19 vaccine on or before May 4, 2021, they will also be regarded to have completed the vaccination course of the relevant COVID-19 vaccine, subject to the vaccine used being included on the list of vaccines recognised for this purpose as published on the Government's COVID-19 thematic website (www.coronavirus.gov.hk/pdf/list of recognised covid19 vaccines.pdf).

- 2. Any person who had been present at Discovery Park (only the shopping mall is included), 398 Castle Peak Road Tsuen Wan, Tsuen Wan, New Territories, Hong Kong for more than one hour at any time on April 26, 2021 (including but not limited to full-time, part-time and relief staff and visitors), has to undergo testing by May 18, 2021. If persons subject to compulsory testing have previously undergone testing between May 13 and May 15, 2021, they would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in the compulsory testing notice.

C. Others

1. Any person who had been present at HKVNS Alumni Association Kindergarten(KCC), G/F (Portion) and 1/F, Kowloon Chamber of Commerce Building, 2 Liberty Avenue, Ho Man Tin, Kowloon, Hong Kong for more than two hours at any time during the period from May 2 to May 15, 2021 (including but not limited to full-time, part-time and relief staff, students and visitors), has to undergo testing by May 18, 2021. If persons subject to compulsory testing choose to undergo testing using the specimen bottles distributed by the Centre for Health Protection, they have to return the specimen bottle with the sample by May 20, 2021. If persons subject to compulsory testing have previously undergone testing between May 13 and May 15, 2021, they would be taken to have complied with the requirements set out in the compulsory testing notice.
