- Note (1): Under normal circumstances, the Fire Services Department (FSD) will dispatch the ambulances which can arrive at the scene soonest to handle the emergency ambulance calls. In day-to-day mobilisation, the Fire Services Communications Centre will dispatch ambulances to other ambulance depots for stand-by according to the operation situation of individual ambulance depot, so as to make good use of emergency ambulance resources and handle the demand of each district for emergency ambulance service in a more flexible approach. To better reflect the situation of ambulance depots handling the actual demand for ambulance calls, the tables set out the number of calls in Hong Kong and Islands, Kowloon and the New Territories.
- Note (2): The FSD provides "non-emergency call" ambulance service in outlying islands. Moreover, since the outbreak of COVID-19, the FSD has also been providing "non-emergency call" ambulance service to convey patients with confirmed COVID-19 to various community treatment facilities according to the arrangement agreed with the Department of Health and the Hospital Authority. Therefore, the FSD has also provided "non-emergency call" ambulance service in Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories in 2020.
