







Date of Issue	Description
January 18, 2022	<p>1. Year of the Tiger</p> <p>This is the eleventh issue in the fourth Lunar New Year special stamp series. This issue features a set of four stamps and a stamp sheetlet showing the Tiger in different handicrafts, heralding the Year of the Tiger full of blessing and happiness. In addition, a stamp sheetlet and a silk stamp sheetlet will be released to celebrate the start of a new year, wishing a robust Year of the Tiger.</p>   

Date of Issue	Description
January 18, 2022	<p>1a. Gold and Silver Stamp Sheetlet on Lunar New Year Animals –Ox/Tiger</p> <p>Bidding adieu to the Year of the Ox and ringing in the Year of the Tiger, the Ox and the Tiger are paired together to celebrate the new year. The stamp sheetlet features a Year of the Ox stamp finished with silver hot foil stamping and a Year of the Tiger stamp in 22K gold plating. Accompanied with a certificate of authenticity, it is ideal both as a gift and for private collection.</p>  <p>The image shows a rectangular stamp sheetlet with a colorful background of a mountain landscape. February 4, 2022	<p>2. XXIV Olympic Winter Games Beijing 2022</p> <p>The XXIV Olympic Winter Games Beijing 2022 will be held in February 2022. This is the first time for China to host the Winter Games. A set of four stamps features the various sport events.</p>  <p>The image shows a set of four stamps for the XXIV Olympic Winter Games Beijing 2022. February 18, 2022	<p>3. Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area Development</p> <p>This set of eleven stamps with a face value of \$2 each, illustrates the latest development of the Greater Bay Area. It brings new opportunities to Hong Kong which participates proactively in the development of an international first-class bay area ideal for living, working and travelling.</p> 
April 21, 2022	<p>4. China's Aerospace Development</p> <p>“China's Aerospace Development” depicting the milestones of China's Aerospace Development since the 1970s. The stamp sheetlet is designed in an oval shape of the universe. It contains two round-shaped stamps symbolising the view of the aerospace from the spaceship.</p>

May 26, 2022	<p>5. Local Snacks in Hong Kong II</p> <p>The most authentic manifestation of Hong Kong’s local food culture must be our wide range of local snacks. Following the “Local Snacks in Hong Kong” special stamps issued in 2021, this set of six stamps and a stamp sheetlet themed on “Local Snacks in Hong Kong II”, bring back more classic snacks, including siu mai, egg tart, fish and lettuce soup, Hong Kong waffle cake, dragon’s beard candy, sachima and black sesame roll, etc., enabling everyone to recall our collective memories.</p> 
June 30, 2022	<p>6. Hong Kong Palace Museum</p> <p>Located at the western tip of the West Kowloon Cultural District, the Hong Kong Palace Museum is scheduled to open in mid-2022. Embracing new curatorial approaches, the Museum will offer a Hong Kong perspective and a global vision, presenting the finest objects from the Palace Museum and other leading cultural institutions around the world. The special stamps under the theme of “Hong Kong Palace Museum” showcase the precious collections from the Palace Museum.
