Under the premise that the overall sector-wide percentage of total non-local students to the approved student number target in that particular study level remains within the 20% ceiling, the current practice allows individual universities’ over-enrolment of non-local students at a proportion which is slightly beyond 20%, so as to increase admission flexibility.
