The acts of the eight persons absconded overseas against whom arrest warrants were issued for allegedly committing the offences that endanger national security under the Hong Kong National Security Law

Persons involved in the case	The offences involved [and the provisions in the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Facts of the case concerned
46-year old male Yam Kevin	"Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	In November and December 2022, Yam Kevin met foreign government officials to instigate "sanctions" to be imposed by foreign countries against officials of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region ("HKSAR") Government. In May 2023, in a hearing held by a foreign authority, Yam also urged foreign countries to impose "sanctions" against personnel of the Judiciary and prosecutors of the HKSAR.
74-year old male Yuan Gong-yi	"Subversion" and "Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 22 and 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Between July 2020 and May 2023, through different platforms and means, Yuan Gong-yi repeatedly urged foreign countries to impose "sanctions" against officials of the HKSAR Government and personnel of the Judiciary and engaged in other hostile activities against the HKSAR. Between July 2022 and May 2023, Yuan formed a body of power named "The Hong Kong Parliament" to launch a "referendum" in order to achieve "self-determination" and subvert the State power.

<p>26-year old female Kwok Fung-yee</p>	<p>"Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]</p>	<p>Between September 2021 and February 2022, Kwok Fung-yee attended meetings and campaigns in foreign countries as a core member of the "Hong Kong Democracy Council" and met foreign politicians and government officials to call for "sanctions" or blockade to be imposed, and other hostile activities to be engaged in against the People's Republic of China and the HKSAR.</p>
<p>45-year old male Kwok Wing-hang</p>	<p>"Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]</p>	<p>In September 2021, Kwok Wing-hang wrote in a report published by an organisation outside Hong Kong to voice his support for a series of "policy recommendation" in the report to urge governments across the globe to impose "sanctions" or blockade, and engage in other hostile activities against the People's Republic of China and the HKSAR. In December 2022, in a meeting held by an organisation outside Hong Kong, KWOK also appealed for imposing financial sanctions and engaging in other hostile activities against the HKSAR.</p>

Persons involved in the case	The offences involved [and the provisions in the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Facts of the case concerned
41-year old male Hui Chi-fung	"Incitement to secession", "Incitement to subversion" and "Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 21, 23 and 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Since March 2021, Hui Chi-fung, jointly with others, has initiated the "2021 Hong Kong Charter" and repeatedly advocated "Taiwan independence", "Hong Kong independence" and the overthrow of the basic system of the People's Republic of China established by the Constitution of the People's Republic of China through social media platforms. Between January 2021 and December 2022, Hui published posts on social media to urge foreign countries to impose "sanctions" and engage in other hostile activities against the People's Republic of China and the HKSAR Government.
51-year old male Mung Siu-tat	"Incitement to secession" [Article 21 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	In June 2022, in a meeting held by an organisation outside Hong Kong, Mung Siu-tat smeared the Central People's Government and the HKSAR Government and advocated separating the HKSAR from the People's Republic of China.

Persons involved in the case	The offences involved [and the provisions in the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Facts of the case concerned
29-year old male Lau Cho-dik	"Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Between July 2020 and June 2021, through various kind of platforms and establishing the "Hong Kong Liberty", Lau Cho-dik continuously urged foreign countries to impose "sanctions" or blockade, or engage in other hostile activities against the People's Republic of China and the HKSAR.
29-year old male Law Kwun-chung	"Incitement to secession" and "Collusion with a foreign country or with external elements to endanger national security" [Article 21 and 29 of the Hong Kong National Security Law]	Between July 2020 and November 2022, Law Kwun-chung, through various means including attending hearings, meeting foreign politicians, participating in media interviews, issuing open letters, taking part in petitions and publishing posts or videos on social media, advocated separating the HKSAR from the People's Republic of China and urged foreign countries to impose "sanctions" or blockade, or engage in other hostile activities against the People's Republic of China and the HKSAR.
