

Night Vibes Hong Kong

Introduction

Lifestyle habits of many people changed following three years of a global pandemic. To create a dynamic vibe in Hong Kong with a view to attracting citizens to go out and revitalise the city's nightlife, the Government has launched the "Night Vibes Hong Kong" campaign to unite different sectors of the community to organise events with unique and creative ideas.

A wealth of diversified "Night Vibes Hong Kong" events with local characteristics will be held from around Mid-Autumn Festival, running across National Day, Halloween, Christmas and New Year until early 2024. Taking place all over the city and covering entertainment, arts, culture, consumption and more, these events cater for people from different age groups and sectors.

Not only can citizens and tourists join various kinds of exciting activities, but they can also enjoy discounts offered by different organisations.

We encourage Hong Kong people to actively participate in the "Night Vibes Hong Kong" events, feeling the vibrancy and energy of Hong Kong's nightlife together!

Highlights

Art & culture experience

- Theatres to launch various types of ticket discounts for night-time screenings.
- The Hong Kong Museum of Art, the Hong Kong Science Museum and the Hong Kong Space Museum will offer nighttime museum experience to the public and the tourists, and extend their opening hours to 10:00pm. from Friday to Sunday and public holidays.
- M+, West Kowloon Cultural District will offer in-gallery activities and workshops at nighttime.
- Tai Kwun will offer a wide variety of nighttime performances and art activities in the coming six months.

Harbourfront leisure experience

- Harbourfront sites will hold a series of activities, including food stalls and markets, musical performances, a drone performance, art gallery exhibitions and film screenings. Citizens and tourists can enjoy different exciting evening activities with a stunning view on both sides of Victoria Harbour.
- The Hong Kong Wine & Dine Festival will make its return physically to the Central Harbourfront Event Space in November, providing worldwide liquor assortments and delights, as well as emerging wine products to citizens and tourists. There will also be a month-long citywide dining promotion of restaurants and bars.

Festive vibrant experience

- The Tai Hang Fire Dragon Dance will resume for the first time since the pandemic this Mid-Autumn Festival, together with a large-scale drone show jointly organised by Hong Kong and Shenzhen at the same time. As well as lanterns, Mid-Autumn Lantern Carnivals in the Victoria Park will also have Cantonese opera showcases under a bamboo theatre, while there will be performances by young performers and acrobatics troupes at venues in Sha Tin and Tuen Mun.
- The National Day Fireworks Display will be resumed for the first time in five years, where citizens and tourists can celebrate the National Day together on both sides of the Victoria Harbour.
- Two major theme parks, Ocean Park and Hong Kong Disneyland, will present Halloween themed events respectively, offering a haunted and exciting experience.
- A giant outdoor Christmas tree will be set up in the West Kowloon Cultural District for the Hong Kong WinterFest. The Hong Kong Tourism Board will also organise an outdoor countdown event, with spectacular fireworks to celebrate the arrival of 2024.
- Lunar New Year fairs across the territory will resume with dry goods stalls and featured stalls in the Victoria Park. An outdoor parade will also be resumed on the night of the Lunar New Year's Day.

Diversified leisure experience

- Over 80 shopping malls will organise various cultural and sports events and outdoor night markets, provide dining and consumption offers, and extend their opening hours in light of the nighttime activities. More than 100 Lan Kwai Fong Association members' restaurants and bars will provide dining offers.
- Members of the public can enjoy free admission to the Public Enclosure of the Happy Valley Racecourse every Wednesday to enjoy a host of themed performances, the Beer Garden and delectable treats at the trackside.

- MTR will launch the "Nighttime Delights Ride 5 Get 1 Free", offering a free domestic single ride for every five night rides exiting after 10:30pm.
- The Hong Kong Tourism Board will offer the "Hong Kong Night Treats" dining voucher for visitors, and Open-top Bus tour at a special price.
- The 57th Hong Kong Brands and Products Expo, featuring about 900 outdoor booths, will offer a full palette of goods, food, entertainment and fun.
- The Hong Kong Tourism Board is discussing with different stakeholders to explore ways to enhance the atmosphere of the Temple Street night market, with a view to increasing its attractiveness through new elements.
