Background of PISA 2022

The Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) 2022 was conducted under the auspices of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), with 81 countries or economies participating in the study. It aims to assess the mathematical, scientific and mother tongue reading literacy of 15-year-old students, collect data on factors that affect their learning, and compare the effectiveness of the education systems of participating countries or economies.

Since 2000, PISA has been conducted every three years. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the eighth cycle of PISA was postponed to 2022. The EDB commissioned the Chinese University of Hong Kong to conduct the main study in Hong Kong from May to July 2022. A total of 5 907 15-year-old students from 163 secondary schools participated in PISA 2022, in which 1 663 students participated in the cognitive test of the creative thinking assessment.
