Notes:

[1] For VTC's publicly-funded programmes, the non-local student quota is equivalent to 40% of the local student places.

As regards the self-financing post-secondary sector, save for MMT students, there is no quota restriction on the admission of non-local students to full-time locally-accredited self-financing local sub-degree, undergraduate, taught postgraduate, and research postgraduate programmes. For MMT students, currently six local self-financing post-secondary institutions, namely, Hong Kong Metropolitan University (HKMU), Hong Kong Shue Yan University (HKSYU), The Hang Seng University of Hong Kong (HSUHK), Hong Kong Chu Hai College, Tung Wah College, and Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong under VTC, have been approved by the Ministry of Education (MoE) to admit Mainland students to their full-time locally-accredited self-financing local degree programmes. The other institutions can only admit students from Macao and Taiwan (but not the Mainland) to their degree programmes. There is no quota restriction for postgraduate programmes but there is quota restriction for sub-degree and undergraduate (including top-up degree) programmes. For the three self-financing universities, namely HKMU, HKSYU and HSUHK, the relevant quota is 20 per cent of the total student enrolment in such programmes in the preceding academic year. The relevant quota is 10 per cent for the other three self-financing institutions. As regards sub-degree programmes, all self-financing institutions may admit MMT students to their full-time locally-accredited self-financing local sub-degree programmes. Except for the three self-financing universities mentioned above, which have a quota of 20%, the quota for other institutions is 10%.

For VTC's publicly-funded programmes, the relevant percentage refers to the percentage of the number of non-local students to the number of places of the relevant publicly-funded programmes in that academic year; while for self-financing programmes, it refers to the percentage of MMT students to the total student enrolment in such programmes in the preceding academic year.

The Education Bureau (EDB) notes that the number of MMT students in some self-financing institutions have exceeded the relevant quota restriction. The EDB has liaised with relevant institutions to understand the situation of their admission of MMT students, and requested the institutions to provide explanations and to strictly adhere to the prevailing requirements on admitting MMT students.

[2] Relevant figures of the publicly-funded programmes under VTC include those of its member institutions, namely Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education (IVE) / Hong Kong Design Institute (HKDI) / Hong Kong Institute of Information Technology (HKIIT) / Chinese Culinary Institute / International Culinary Institute / Maritime Services Training Institute.
