Homicide	Third lowest since records began in 1969, lowest on record since 1969 excluding the cases concerning the industrial accident that happened on Anderson Road in 2022 and resulted in three deaths and were later reclassified as manslaughters and included in the figure for 2024 upon receipt of legal advice from the Department of Justice (19 cases)	Highest since records began in 1977, same as in multiple years (100%)
Robbery	Second lowest since records began in 1969 (90 cases)	Highest since records began in 1977 (92.2%)
Burglary	Second lowest since records began in 1969 (1 220 cases)	Second highest since records began in 1977 (38%)
Wounding and Serious Assault	Lowest on record since 1973 (or over the past 51 years) (3 614 cases)	Second highest on record since 1981 (or over the past 43 years) (72.9%)
Arson	Lowest on record since 1984 (or over the past 40 years) (234 cases)	Second highest since records began in 1982 (44.9%)
Snatching	Lowest since records began in 1969 (64 cases)	Highest since records began in 1977 (60.9%)
Theft from Vehicle	Lowest since records began in 1977 (540 cases)	Second highest since records began in 1977 (31.9%)
