Note 1: Upon enrolment in the CDCC Pilot Scheme through the District Health Centres / District Health Centre Expresses (collectively DHCs), eligible participants may choose to be matched with a family doctor and carry out pairing process at a service point near their place of residence, workplace or any other suitable service point according to their own

preferences, and they do not necessarily have to choose a family doctor in the same district. Eligible persons may also choose to enroll in the Scheme at family doctor clinics in various districts which provide direct participant enrolment services and be matched with the family doctor concerned. Therefore, the above figures only show the number of enrolments in each district (via the DHCs or family doctor clinics), but not the number of participants in each district.

Note 2: Figures are rounded to the nearest hundred and may not add up to the total due to rounding.
