II. The Hong Kong Childhood Immunisation Programme (HKCIP)

With a view to preventing communicable diseases with public health significance, Bacillus Calmette-Guerin (BCG) vaccine and the first dose of Hepatitis B vaccine are first given to newborn babies in hospitals under the current arrangement. Pre-school children (aged 0 to 5) then receive various types of vaccines and boosters at recommended ages of vaccination at the Department of Health (DH)'s Maternal and Child Health Centres (MCHCs) free-of-charge. As for primary school children, vaccination service is provided at schools by the

DH's outreach School Immunisation Teams (SITs). The Student Health Service (SHS) of the DH also provides free mop-up vaccination at Student Health Service Centres for secondary school students who have not completed the recommended immunisation.

(i) Eligible newborn babies to children aged 5

Eligible babies and children can receive vaccination free-of-charge at the MCHCs. The number of vaccines administered at the MCHCs under the HKCIP for babies and children over the past five years (2020 to 2024) is tabulated below:

(ii) Eligible primary school children

The SITs provide free vaccination services to eligible Primary 1 school children, Primary 5 school girls and Primary 6 school children across the city (vaccines include measles, mumps, rubella and varicella (second dose) vaccine, combined diphtheria, tetanus, acellular pertussis and inactivated poliovirus vaccine (booster dose), human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine and hepatitis B vaccine). Over the past five years (2020 to 2024), the number of vaccines administered for school children is tabulated below:

The DH has been conducting periodic city-wide immunisation coverage surveys among preschool children. The most recent survey was conducted in 2024, targeting children aged three to five. The results showed that the overall vaccination rate for all vaccines under the immunisation programme exceeded 97%
