Note 1 : Application is made on the basis of Deed of Mutual Covenant (DMC). Some buildings may have more than one DMC, and some DMCs may cover more than one building. The number of applications received therefore may not correspond to the number of buildings involved.

Note 2 : The figures exclude 343 applications approved between 2021 and 2025 that were subsequently revoked by the URA due to unsatisfactory progress or withdrawn by the owners. Furthermore, as applications may be processed across years, the number of approved applications may not correspond to the number of applications received in the same year.

Note 3 : As it takes time to carry out and complete the relevant works, the number of works completed may not correspond to the number of approved applications in the same year.

Note 4 : The figures exclude 422 Category 2 buildings selected by the BD between 2021 and 2025, but repair works not proceeded in default by the BD as the owners subsequently decided to carry out the prescribed works on their own.

Note 5 : As it takes time to carry out and complete the relevant works, the number of Category 2 buildings with repair works completed may not correspond to the number of buildings selected by the BD in the same year.

Note 6 : The figures exclude 297 applications approved between 2021 and 2025 that were subsequently revoked by the URA due to unsatisfactory progress or withdrawn by the owners. Furthermore, as applications may be processed across years, the number of approved applications may not correspond to the number of applications received in the same year.

- Note 7 : Lift Modernisation Subsidy Scheme invited two rounds of applications in 2018 and 2019, receiving applications for 4 516 and 2 890 lifts respectively.
- Note 8 : As applications may be processed across years, the number of approved applications may not correspond to the number of applications received in the same year.
- Note 9 : Following the end of the pandemic and considering that most of the application cases are concurrently participating in Operation Building Bright 2.0, in which the subsidies already cover works for common drainage systems, the Government and the URA ceased to accept applications for the Building Drainage System Repair Subsidy Scheme on May 31 2024.
- Note 10 : The figures exclude 254 applications approved between 2021 and 2025 that were subsequently revoked by the URA due to unsatisfactory progress or withdrawn by the owners. Furthermore, as applications may be processed across years, the number of approved applications may not correspond to the number of applications received in the same year.
- Note 11 : The figures exclude 479 Category 2 buildings selected by the BD between 2021 and 2025, but repair works not proceeded in default by the BD as the owners subsequently decided to carry out the prescribed works on their own.
